

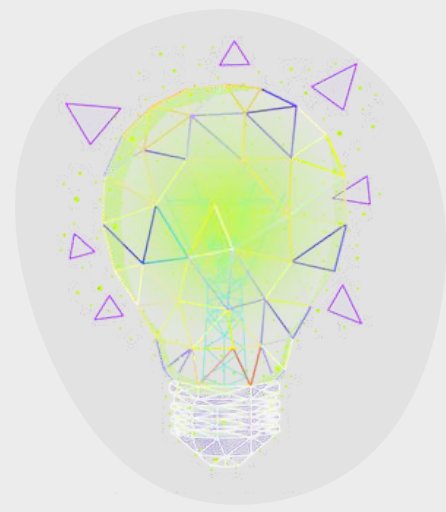

SECOND TRAINING ABOUT DESIGN THINKING
AS AN INNOVATIVE EDUCATIONAL
METHODOLOGY FOR FOSTERING PROBLEM-
SOLVING SKILL SETS THROUGH DIGITAL
EDUCATION IN BERLIN, GERMANY

From the 27th - 31st of March 2023, **Comparative Research Network e.V.** together with associated stakeholder Möwensee Grundschule hosted the 2nd LTTA in Berlin, Germany. During this week the participants from each partner country took part in the training about Design Thinking. This is a mindset and approach to learning, collaboration, and problem solving. In practice, the design process is a structured framework for identifying challenges, gathering information, generating potential solutions, refining ideas, and testing solutions. The training consisted of 5 days dedicated to: understanding and observing, identifying perspectives and ideas, building prototypes, pitching and presenting, testing and feedback.

The participants learnt what design thinking is by experiencing it and doing. We use real problems from the life of a Berlin school: **Möwensee Grundschule**. First we visited the school to learn and to get to know the school, teachers, pupils and its challenges. Then we worked together in 2 groups to find solution and build prototypes for 2 real challenges:

1. HOW TO HELP STUDENTS RECOGNISE THEIR SECOND LANGUAGE AS A RESOURCE?
2. HOW TO RAISE AWARENESS OF THE 'PUPIL'S BUDGET' AMONG STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES?



RESULTS

Two prepared solutions (Day of Language and off-line / on-line suggestion box) have been presented to Berlin's school teachers, who gave us their feedback and who will test those prototypes.

The course was created to give the introduction to the methodology and to use it in the classroom as a problem solving approach.
